CONGRESSIONAL RECORD ON REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM 116TH CONGRESS, 2ND SESSION

NARAL Pro-Choice America's 2020 Congressional Record on Reproductive Freedom documents the key House and Senate votes taken on this issue during the second session of the 116th Congress.

2020 was a difficult and challenging year. Congress and the country as a whole grappled with multiple intersecting crises: the Trump administration's obstinate refusal to combat the COVID-19 pandemic, resulting in hundreds of thousands of deaths in the United States alone; an uprising led by racial justice leaders to drive a national reckoning around white supremacy, systemic racism, and racial violence; and a president who intentionally attacked the foundation of our democracy — our right to vote — by spreading disinformation about the electoral process in an effort to hold on to power regardless of the will of the people. These events laid bare the work that still needs to be done so that our families and communities can thrive. NARAL Pro-Choice America believes that there can be no reproductive freedom without freedom from tyranny and oppression and we are working with our allies to fight for that ultimate goal.

In the face of Republican control of the White House and Senate, the Democratic majority in the House of Representatives highlighted its progressive priorities by passing multiple pieces of legislation that would advance civil rights and gender equity. Early in the year, the House passed a joint resolution removing obstacles to the ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment, demonstrating a commitment to end discrimination against, and ensure full equality for, women. In an historic first, the House voted in favor of statehood for the District of Columbia, a necessary first step to ensure full rights and representation for DC residents. As a

state, DC would finally be able to eliminate barriers to reproductive healthcare imposed by Congressional Republicans who have long restricted abortion access in the nation's capital. The House also passed the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act to end employment discrimination based on pregnancy, despite a last-minute attempt by anti-choice Republicans to allow religious employers to refuse to comply with the law. Unsurprisingly, the Republican-controlled Senate did not take up any of these bills.

This year, the House also took the lead on several much-needed COVID-19 relief packages, which included NARAL priorities such as paid leave and sick time. However, further Democratic efforts were thwarted by Republicans' continued insistence on putting ideology over the health and well-being of people across the United States. On one end of the spectrum, Senate Republicans exploited the urgency of the pandemic response to insert in one bill an expansion of a discriminatory abortion coverage restriction at a time when lawmakers should be focused on expanding access to healthcare. On the other end, Senate Republicans simply refused to take up additional relief legislation, letting COVID-19 continue to ravage people's lives, health, and economic security.

The Senate started this year, as it has the last several years, by attacking reproductive freedom. Republican leader Mitch McConnell held votes on a nationwide ban on abortion after 20 weeks and on a bill that would insert politicians into family decisions. Although it was clear from the start that both bills would fail on procedural votes, the anti-choice Senate wanted to broadcast its priorities. And as they have for the entirety of the Trump administration, anti-choice senators continued to green-light Trump's takeover of the federal judiciary by helping him stack the courts with judges hostile to reproductive freedom. Instead of addressing the pandemic, Republicans allowed Trump to appoint more than 220 judges in one term — a record that has not been met for several decades.

The battle over the independence and impartiality of the federal judiciary came to a head this year when the incomparable Ruth Bader Ginsburg, associate justice of the U.S.

Supreme Court, passed away. Despite the fact that the election was already underway, Trump, McConnell, and Senate Republicans made a power grab to cement a conservative supermajority on the Supreme Court, illegitimately ramming through the confirmation of anti-choice Amy Coney Barrett. Republicans made their misplaced priorities very clear: they value their ideology and power over the health, well-being, and will of the American people. Justice Ginsburg was a fearless champion for equality and justice, including reproductive freedom, and we honor her legacy by continuing our fight for the rights and freedoms she worked to advance.

While there is a tremendous amount of work still to be done, 2020 ended on a better note. Voters turned out in historic numbers to make their voices heard and elect Joe Biden and Kamala Harris. Across the country, voters chose leaders who respect reproductive freedom and who will protect safe and accessible abortion care. As we continue to face the COVID-19 pandemic and confront entrenched white supremacy, President-elect Biden and Vice President-elect Harris will prioritize fact-driven policy and the health and well-being of Americans, using evidence rather than an ideological agenda to guide their decision-making. As we begin to undo the harm done by the Trump administration, we take heart in the fact that the Biden-Harris administration has made clear its commitment to protecting and advancing reproductive freedom. This win brings us one step closer to making sure that reproductive freedom is a reality for *every* body.

- 1. Brasher Confirmation.** Vote to confirm anti-choice nominee Andrew Brasher to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit. Confirmed 52-43. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation. (2/11/20).
- 2. Political Interference in Family Decisions: Motion to End Debate.** Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act, S.311. Motion to invoke cloture (end debate) on the motion to proceed to the Sasse (R-NE) bill to interfere with the medical practice of abortion care under the threat of severe penalties. Three-fifths of the Senate (60 votes) is required to invoke cloture on legislation. Cloture motion failed 56-41. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against cloture. (2/25/20).
- 3. 20-Week Abortion Ban: Motion to End Debate.** Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act, S.3275. Motion to invoke cloture (end debate) on the motion to proceed to the Graham (R-SC) bill to ban abortion after 20 weeks nationwide. Three-fifths of the Senate (60 votes) is required to invoke cloture on legislation. Cloture motion failed 53-44. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against cloture. (2/25/20).
- 4. Walker Confirmation.** Vote to confirm anti-choice nominee Justin Reed Walker to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia. Confirmed 51-42. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation. (6/18/20).
- 5. Wilson Confirmation.** Vote to confirm anti-choice nominee Cory T. Wilson to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit. Confirmed 52-48. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation. (6/24/20).
- 6. Dugan Confirmation.** Vote to confirm anti-choice nominee David W. Dugan to the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Illinois. Confirmed 55-41. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation. (9/16/20).
- 7. McGlynn Confirmation.** Vote to confirm anti-choice nominee Stephen P. McGlynn to the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Illinois. Confirmed 55-41. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation. (9/16/20).
- 8. Barrett Nomination: Motion to End Debate.** Motion to invoke cloture (end debate) on the nomination of anti-choice nominee Amy Coney Barrett to the post of associate justice of the Supreme Court. A simple majority is required to invoke cloture on nominations. Cloture motion passed 51-48. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against cloture. (10/25/20).
- 9. Barrett Nomination: Confirmation.** Vote to confirm anti-choice nominee Amy Coney Barrett to the post of associate justice of the Supreme Court. Confirmed 52-48. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation. (10/26/20).
- 10. Crouse Confirmation.** Vote to confirm anti-choice nominee Toby Crouse to the U.S. District Court for the District of Kansas. Confirmed 50-43. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation. (11/17/20).

VOTE DESCRIPTIONS HOUSE

- Equality Under the Constitution.** A joint resolution to eliminate the deadline for ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) to the U.S. Constitution, H.J.Res.79. Final Passage. Approved 232-183. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was in support of the resolution (2/13/20).
- DC Statehood.** Washington, D.C. Admission Act, H.R.51. Final Passage. A bill to admit Washington, DC as the 51st state. Passed 232-180. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was in support of the bill (6/26/20).
- Refusal to Comply: Pregnant Workers Fairness Act.** Pregnant Workers Fairness Act, H.R.2694. Motion to recommit the bill with instructions to add an exemption that would allow religious employers to deny reasonable accommodations to pregnant working people. Failed 177-226. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against the motion to recommit (9/17/20).
- Pregnant Workers Fairness Act.** Pregnant Workers Fairness Act, H.R.2694. Final Passage. A bill to eliminate pregnancy discrimination and promote health and economic security by requiring employers to provide reasonable accommodations to working people for limitations arising out of pregnancy, childbirth, and related medical conditions. Passed 329-73. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was in support of the bill (9/17/20).
- Condemning Forced Sterilization.** A resolution condemning unwanted, unnecessary medical procedures on individuals without their full, informed consent, H.Res.1153. Final passage. This measure condemns the heinous acts of forced sterilization of immigrant women in Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) custody. Approved 232-157. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was in support of the resolution (10/2/20).
